**Call to Order:** 5:34 p.m.

**1. Roll Call:**

**3. Minutes**

Minutes of the April 25, 2017 meeting were approved by consensus.

**4. 2017 Bloomberg Philanthropies Mayors Challenge Grant**

Mayor Cabaldon discussed the Mayors Challenge and the potential grant opportunities for the City with a successful submission. The Challenge is looking for applicants to identify problems and issues facing cities, and innovative solutions to those issues.

**5. Elkhorn Playground—Grant Award**

Director Tuttle noted that the City has been awarded a \$40,000 Play Spaces Grant from the National Recreation and Park Association and the Walt Disney Company for improvements to Elkhorn Park. Improvements to be funded by the grant include replacing the dated swing set and play structure, a new shade structure, picnic tables that double as game tables, and ADA access improvements. Director Tuttle also noted a new California Parks & Recreation Society grant that the City is looking into, for which the Play Spaces grant award could potentially be used as grant match

**6. Bryte Park**

Director Tuttle noted that the City Council recently awarded a contract for the construction of Bryte Park Phase 2 improvements which will continue to implement the Bryte Park Master Plan and includes construction of a community gathering area, parking lot, sport court, restroom, landscaping and a pedestrian crosswalk. The Council also recently allocated \$80k for a new shade structure for the KaBoom! play structure.

**7. Access from Clarksburg Trail to the Rec Center**

WUSD Trustee Pizzotti noted there is not an established connection from the trail to the Rec Center via sidewalk, such that Rec Center patrons would have to go through the school campus. Discussed adding wayfinding signage and/or sidewalk around ring road. Mayor Cabaldon noted this could be a project for consideration as part of the City's Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trail improvements. Question remains on responsibility for cost of the improvements. No action was taken.

**8. College Promise**

Assistant Superintendent Parsons shared statistics on River City HS college enrollment and noted RCHS school counselor was not aware of the College Promise program. Assistant Superintendent Parsons shared a question from Trustee Kirby-Gonzalez regarding current marketing for the College Promise. Mayor Cabaldon noted that such issues are more appropriately addressed at the staff level; the 2x2 should be addressing policy-related issues. Program Manager Winbrock gave an overview on the status of the College Promise program, noting that high-value branding/marketing materials are being developed and will be available in the near future. Mr. Winbrock noted there have been 60 applicants for the College Promise program so far and the City has been awarded the Pathways with a Purpose Grant to support its Kids' Home Run program. No action was taken.

**9. 2017-2018 WUSD School Enrollment**

Assistant Superintendent Parsons noted WUSD enrollment is up by 150 students with special day up by 215. There are now two TK classes at Riverbank Elementary and Bridgeway Island has been impacted due to students leaving private and charter schools. As a result, 16 overflow students from with Bridgeway Island as their home school must be assigned to other WUSD elementary schools. River City HS has a projected enrollment of 2145. No action was taken.

**10. Other Business**

Trustee Pizzotti requested follow up from City staff on the question raised at the April 2017 meeting about City land availability at Bridgeway Island Park for siting portables for after school programs.
