2. **Public Presentations**

3. **Minutes**

Minutes of the December 5, 2016 meeting were approved by consensus.

4. **WUSD Community Forum Feedback**

Superintendent Luna comment on the 16 Community Forums that the District held at school sites earlier this year. The topics discussed covered a wide range with a particular focus on the outcomes of the Strategic Planning process that the District is wrapping up. From the feedback received, there were three (3) issues brought up that were shared as they involved the City.

- A. Southport Elementary Crosswalk

The community voiced concerns over the safety of the crosswalk next to the school and were curious if a lighted crosswalk could be installed. The committee discussed this idea at length and it was noted that a procedure is currently in place for requesting this need on the City's website.

- B. Stonegate Elementary Parkway Speed

The concerns disclosed during the community forums in regards to the new parkway access and speed of traffic near Stonegate Elementary were discussed at length. The purpose of the parkway is to have an inner-city freeway that functions at a higher rate of speed. This route is needed to relieve the congestion on Jefferson Boulevard.

- C. Westmore Oaks Elementary Sound Wall

At one of the forums, the public were complimentary and thankful of the work that the City completed in pruning the trees and shrubs that are north of the Westmore Oaks property. However, there is now a noticeable increase in sound due to the lack of a barrier and well as a direct line-of-sight to the school from the freeway. The community was curious if a sound wall could be installed. It was noted that a project of

this nature would require funding and participation from CalTrans as a sound wall would most likely end up on State property.

5. Rivers Land Development Update

The committee discussed the Rivers Land Development at length noting if the developer is satisfied with the school options in the area they would need to make a proposal for a substation to their general plan to have the additional school removed.

6. Possible Restructure: Joint City Meeting with all Elected Officials and School Board Trustees

The committee discussed the possible restructure with all elected officials at length noting that it may help to expedite some of the issues being discussed at times.

7. Measure V / Kids Home Run

Mayor Cabaldon provided and briefly discussed a one-page handout that identified the different components that make up the Kids Home Run initiative including Digital Badges and College Promise. Examples of how different educational paths a student chose would have an impact on how they benefited from the program were disclosed and it was determined as language for Kids Home Run continues to be crafted, criteria for a quality preschool will be determined.

8. Other Business

Council Member Orozco thanked Washington Unified School District for hosting the Principal for a Day Program and would like to further discuss getting stakeholders together to determine how to provide additional assistance to students.

Vice President Pizzotti noted the lack of space on school campuses for after school programs and would like to utilize City land if available for additional portables. The request is being researched and considered.

Subject: Elkhorn Park Grant Award and Bryte Park Improvements Update

The City has been awarded a \$40,000 Play Spaces Grant from the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) and The Walt Disney Company for improvements to Elkhorn Park. The grant award includes improvements to help create a multicultural, multigenerational, family-oriented venue at the park, including replacing the dated swing set and play structure with a new play structure that offers innovative components to accommodate a range of skills and needs. Additional amenities for all ages were also proposed, including installation of a new shade structure and picnic tables that may also double as game tables for ping pong and board games and improved access to the recreation amenities from the park entrance to meet ADA requirements. The \$40,000 grant leverages resources already budgeted by the City to fund the replacement of the shade structure and seating that was recently damaged by storms.

Of the 250+ applications received for the grant program, West Sacramento is one of only 25 agencies nationwide to be awarded grant funding. All grant-funded improvements must be completed by April 2018.

In addition, on July 26, 2017, the City Council awarded a contract for the construction of Bryte Park Phase 2 improvements to Abide Builders. The \$1.6 million project continues to implement the Bryte Park Master Plan and includes construction of a community gathering area, parking lot, sport court, restroom, landscaping and a pedestrian cross walk.

Finally, on the 26 of July, Council also approved much needed shade structures for the KaBOOM! play structure located at Bryte Park. The play structure is exposed to direct sunlight and although trees have been planted along the edges of the play area, it will take many more years of growth to provide adequate shade to protect individual users of the play equipment.
